





Admission requirements Online MSN

ONLINE MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

Here's what you'll need to apply

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) from an accredited university
- 3.0 GPA from undergraduate degree
- U.S. unencumbered state RN license
- Undergraduate Statistics course is required
- Have at least one year of professional nursing experience for FNP and PMHNP or 2 years for AGACNP

You must also include the following with your completed application:

- Application fee
- Transcripts
- Two letters of recommendation
 - Letters of recommendation must be submitted by individuals who can speak to your ability to perform graduate-level work (e.g., former professors, academic counselors, employers, business colleagues).
- CV or resume
- Statement of purpose: Why do you want to attend Hawai'i Pacific University to earn your MSN? Describe your academic objectives, research interests, and career plans. Also discuss how your unique background would contribute to the diversity of HPU's graduate program.

Program

As a family nurse practitioner, you can apply your clinical competence and holistic approach to patient well-being to help transform and stabilize health care delivery. FNPs provide essential preventive and diagnostic services that ease the strains on hospital systems and improve patient health outcomes.

Research shows that patients under the care of nurse practitioners have fewer unnecessary hospital readmissions and potential preventable hospitalizations, higher patient satisfaction, and fewer unnecessary emergency room visits compared to patients who receive care from doctors.*

By completing HPU's online MSN-FNP program, you can qualify to sit for the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) and American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP) exams required for licensure as a family nurse practitioner.

FNP coursework

Students begin the MSN-FNP program by completing six core courses before taking a series of specialized courses covering four key areas of primary care: pediatrics, women's health, adults, and geriatrics. Students may transfer up to 12 eligible credits from another college or university into HPU's online MSN-FNP program.

Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Program

Nearly one in five U.S. adults lives with a mental illness. The number of people screening with moderate to severe symptoms of depression and anxiety increased steadily throughout 2020 due to a combination of factors.* For example, long days spent working at home or isolating from others during the COVID-19 pandemic have led to heightened feelings of loneliness and anxiety for many. This has led to demonstrated efforts to reduce the stigma around mental illness and ensure individuals have easier access to lifesaving psychiatric care.

Our 100% online MSN-PMHNP program prepares you to address the unique mental health needs of patients in a variety of settings, whether virtually or face to face. By completing HPU's online MSN-PMHNP program, you can qualify to sit for the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) exam required for licensure as a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner.

What can I do as a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner?

- Assess, diagnose, and treat the mental health needs of patients of all ages
- Provide therapy and prescribe medications for patients with mental health disorders and substance abuse problems
- Order and administer diagnostic tests
- Perform physical and psychosocial assessments, emergency psychiatric care, and treatment effectiveness evaluations

PMHNP coursework

Students begin the MSN-PMHNP program by completing six core courses before taking a series of specialized courses that explore the treatment of complex mental health needs with a view toward recovery-focused interventions. Students may transfer up to 12 eligible credits from another college or university into HPU's online MSN-PMHNP program.

Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Program

The use of robotics, machine learning, and other advanced technology is set to disrupt hospitals and other acute care settings. These innovations will automate many administrative aspects of patient care, allowing skilled nurses to focus their efforts on improving patient outcomes and implementing interventions using novel approaches.

Adult-gerontology acute care nurse practitioners will perform a vital function in this new health care framework by treating patients diagnosed with acute and chronic illness. They will continue to be instrumental in confronting health inequities among vulnerable and underserved minority populations as our society becomes more diverse — treating complex conditions like cancer, cardiovascular disease, and diabetes.

By completing HPU's online MSN-AGACNP program, you can quality to sit for the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) exam required for licensure as an Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner.

What can I do as an Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner?

- Provide disease prevention services and acute care management for adolescent, adult, and geriatric patients
- Treat complex, acute conditions, primarily in intensive care, trauma, or acute care units but also in specialty clinics and long-term care facilities
- Provide complex monitoring of patient illness
- Devise multifaceted treatment plans for adults and gerontology patients
- Prevent future complications while improving patient health

AGACNP coursework

Students begin the MSN-AGACNP program by completing six core courses before taking a series of specialized courses that address the evaluation and management of adult and gerontologic populations with acute and critical illnesses. Students may transfer up to 12 eligible credits from another college or university into HPU's online MSN-AGACNP program.
